<p><b>Hot Springs Discovery—Walk</b> <i>Starting June 13</i></p> <p>Explore Yellowstone’s powerful geologic past and present while meandering around the Mammoth Hot Springs Terraces. Learn how these dynamic travertine formations are unique among the park’s thermal features. Route climbs stairs; may be strenuous for some. <p><b>Tales of the Travertine—Talk</b> <i>Starting May 30</i></p> <p>The travertine terraces at Mammoth Hot Springs are one of Yellowstone’s most unusual, beautiful, and misunderstood hydrothermal features.
